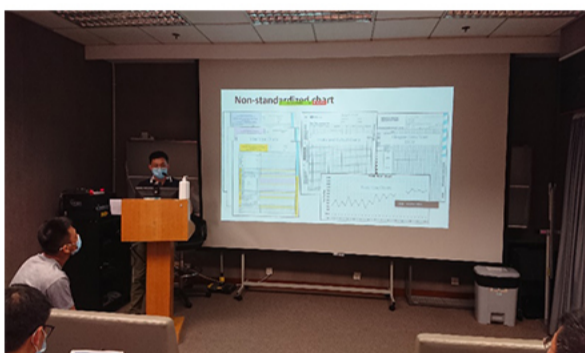

### **Joint Statement of HKCEM and HKSEMS on Accident & Emergency Department Services in COVID-19 pandemic**

Amid the local COVID-19 resurgence, there are concerns on the service demand of Accident and Emergency Department (AED) of public hospitals under the Hospital Authority. This statement outlines the position of Hong Kong Society for Emergency Medicine and Surgery (HKSEMS) and Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine (HKCEM) on the role of AED during the COVID-19 pandemic.

1. AED plays a crucial role in delivering timely, professional assessment and treatment for patients with acute, serious illness. Any improper use of AED jeopardises the care and prolongs the waiting time of patients with genuine needs for AED services.
2. COVID-19 test for asymptomatic individual is not indicated in public AED. Unnecessary staying in the crowded waiting area of AED may increase the risk of contracting infectious diseases. And AED will not provide certificate of COVID-19 test for travel or work purposes.
3. Patients with symptoms compatible with COVID-19 should seek early medical attentions. Patients with mild symptoms may attend Government Outpatient Clinic or private clinics/hospitals for assessment and COVID-19 tests.
4. CHP (“Centre for Health Protection”) advice for the general public on prevention of COVID-19 should be strictly followed to halt the community transmission of COVID-19:
  - hand hygiene
  - masking
  - social distancing
  - avoiding crowded places
