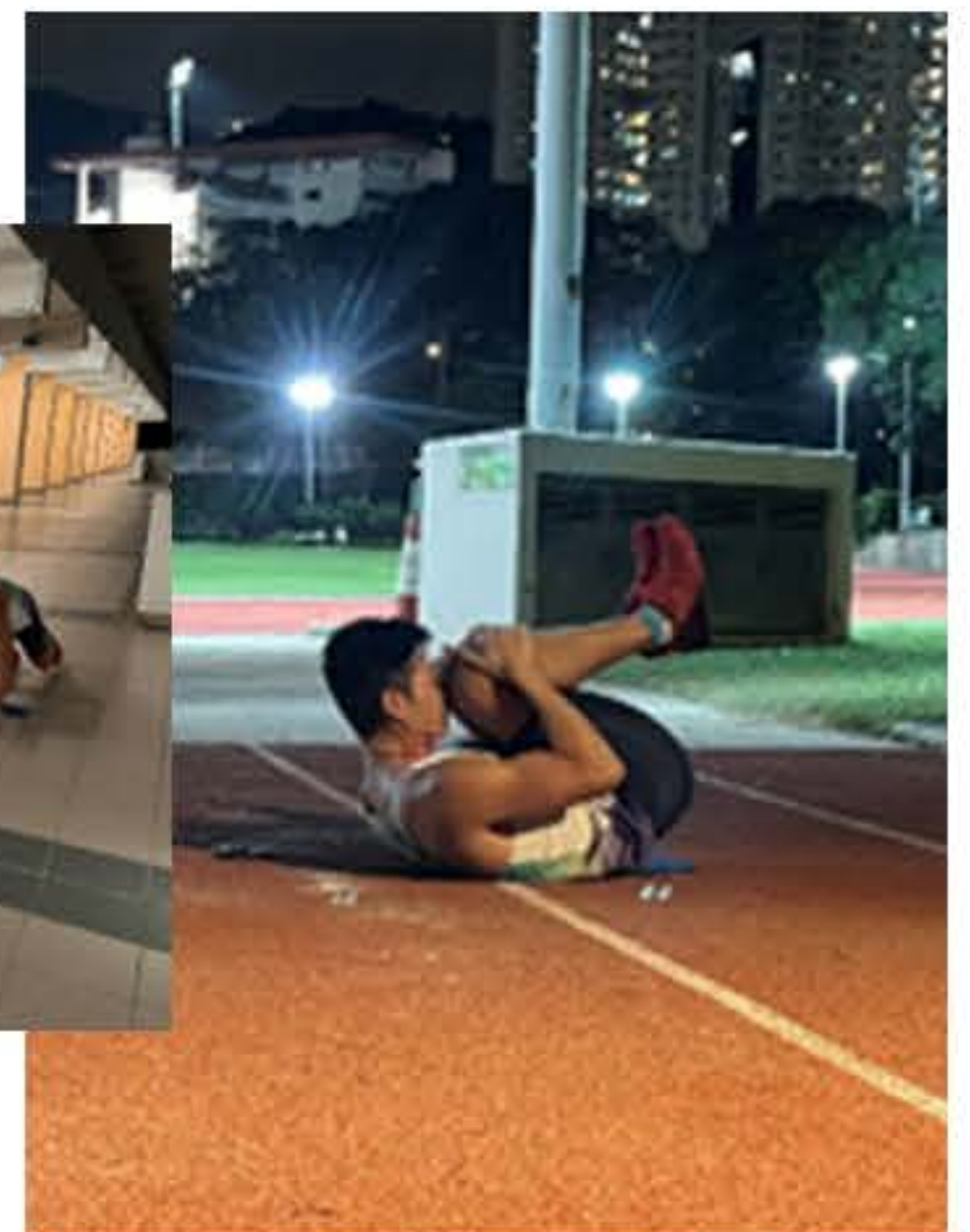

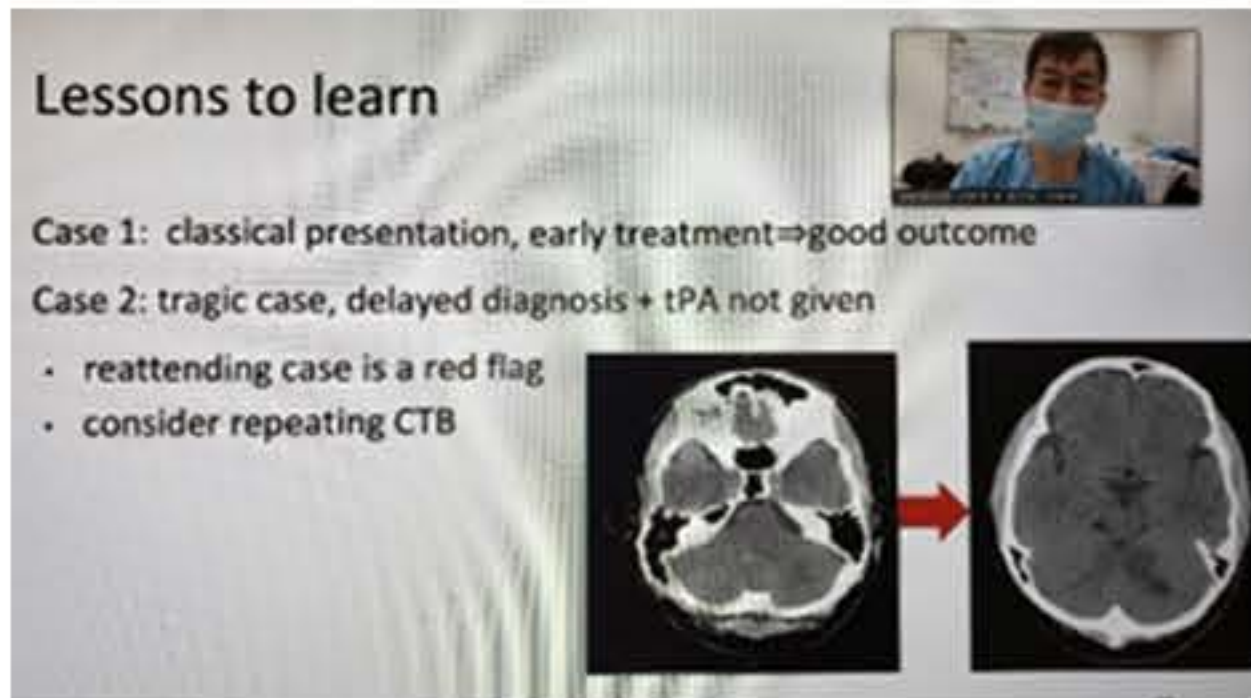

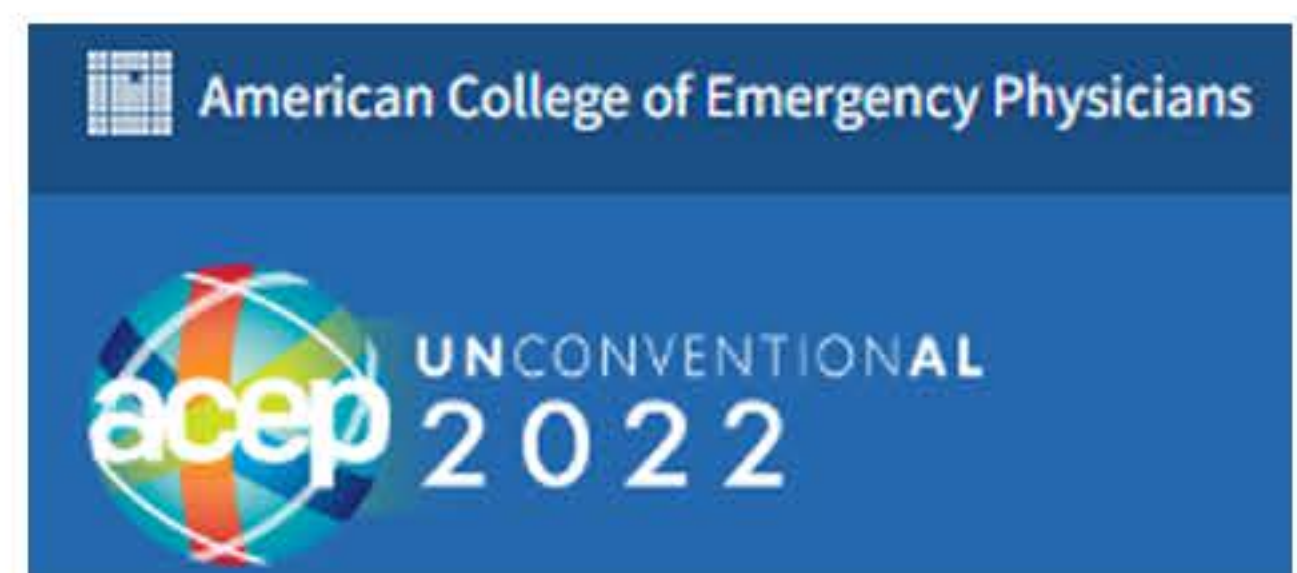

### Highlight of HKCEM CME/CPD Guideline for the cycle 2023-25

#### Changes on Claim Approval

1. Retrospective self claim of CME points for already conducted College approved activities would not be entertained.  
Attendance capture should be done real time.

2. When a Fellow has already fulfilled the CME requirement in the current CME cycle, or has attained maximal points under the intended category, further self claim of CME points will not be entertained.



Allocation of any claimed training activity into particular category for accreditation is based on the nature of majority component of the activity involved. Splitting of any single training activity into truncated sub-sections for individual application is not advisable. Overall maximum points gained/accredited will remain the same.

Concerning the capping of points given to some sub-categories, especially Cat. E2c and E7 about course teaching and students teaching: After deliberation, the College decided to follow the rationale of discussion in 210th Council meeting and the capping will remain status quo, in order to ensure fellows to involve in diversified educational activities which is in line with the HKAM direction.

### In Loving Memory Of Dr. Chan Ka Moon

It is with great sadness and heavy hearts that we announce the passing of our dear friend and colleague Dr Chan Ka Moon, Charles on 23 August 2022.

Ka Moon received his MBBS in 1999, FHKCEM and FHKAM in 2009, and had become an accredited trainer of the HKCEM in 2010. Ka Moon was a dedicated Emergency Medicine Specialist who devoted himself to caring for his patients and serving the community.



He was a Field Medical Officer in the 2008 Olympic and Paralympic Equestrian Event of the Games of XXIX Olympiad, had been an Air Medical Officer of the Government Flying Service since 2005, and had been supporting the Scheme for the Health Care of the Clergy & Religious, a voluntary scheme founded by Catholic doctors and nurses to arrange health check for parish priests and clergy since 2008.



Ka Moon was competent, caring and compassionate. He loved life and had a passion for classical music. He was trusted by his patients, respected by his trainees, loved by his colleagues and valued by the Hospital. His friendly smile made everyone he encountered felt welcomed and valued.

Ka Moon chose to fight his battle with a smile. He had necrotizing fasciitis in 2016, and might have been one of the few rare survivors who enjoyed almost a 100% recovery.

We had a privilege to know Ka Moon. We are deeply saddened by the loss of such incredible Fellow and competent Emergency Medicine Specialist who touched many lives. He will be deeply missed.

Ka Moon is survived by his loving wife, Betty, and we stand by his family in this very difficult time. May he rest in peace.
